



The Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC) document will help you choose a health plan. The SBC shows you how you and the plan would share the cost for covered health care services. **NOTE: Information about the cost of this plan (called the premium) will be provided separately. Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
What is the overall <u>deductible</u>?	For each <u>Plan</u> Year, In- <u>Network</u> : EE Only \$1,500; EE+ Family \$3,000. Out-of-Network: EE Only \$3,000; EE+ Family \$6,000.	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from <u>providers</u> up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the policy, the overall family <u>deductible</u> must be met before the <u>plan</u> begins to pay.
Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u>?	Yes. In- <u>network</u> <u>preventive care</u> is covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> .	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. For example, this <u>plan</u> covers certain <u>preventive services</u> without <u>cost sharing</u> and before you meet your <u>deductible</u> . Are there other <u>deductibles</u> for specific services?	No.	You don't have to meet <u>deductibles</u> for specific services.
What is the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> for this <u>plan</u>?	In- <u>Network</u> : EE Only \$3,000; EE+ Family \$6,000. Out-of-Network: EE Only \$6,000; EE+ Family \$12,000. Prescription: \$3,450 Individual / \$6,900 Family	The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this <u>plan</u> , the overall family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> must be met.
What is not included in the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u>?	<u>Premiums</u> , <u>balance-billing</u> charges & health care this <u>plan</u> doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> .
Will you pay less if you use a <u>network provider</u>?	Yes. See www.aetna.com/docfind or call 1-800-589-2386 for a list of in- <u>network providers</u> .	This <u>plan</u> uses a <u>provider network</u> . You will pay less if you use a <u>provider</u> in the <u>plan's network</u> . You will pay the most if you use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> , and you might receive a bill from a <u>provider</u> for the difference between the <u>provider's</u> charge and what your <u>plan</u> pays (<u>balance billing</u>). Be aware, your <u>network provider</u> might use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> for some services (such as lab work). Check with your <u>provider</u> before you get services.
Do you need a <u>referral</u> to see a <u>specialist</u>?	No.	You can see the <u>specialist</u> you choose without a <u>referral</u> .

Excluded Services & Other Covered Services:

Services Your Plan Generally Does NOT Cover (Check your policy or plan document for more information and a list of any other excluded services.)

- Acupuncture
- Cosmetic surgery
- Dental care (Adult & Child)
- Glasses (Child)
- Long-term care
- Non-emergency care when traveling outside the U.S.
- Prescription drugs
- Private-duty nursing
- Routine eye care (Adult & Child)
- Routine foot care
- Weight loss programs - Except for required preventive services.

Other Covered Services (Limitations may apply to these services. This isn't a complete list. Please see your plan document.)

- Bariatric surgery
- Chiropractic care - 60 visits/plan year combined with rehabilitation services.
- Hearing aids - 1 hearing aid to \$1,400 maximum per ear/36 months for children up to age 19.
- Infertility treatment - Limited to the diagnosis & treatment of underlying medical condition. Artificial insemination & ovulation induction: 6 combined attempts/lifetime. In-vitro fertilization & intracytoplasmic sperm injection: 3 attempts/live birth & \$100,000 maximum/lifetime after 2 years of infertility.

Your Rights to Continue Coverage:

Your Grievance and Appeals Rights:

There are agencies that can help if you have a complaint against your plan for a denial of a claim. This complaint is called a grievance or appeal. Does this plan meet Minimum Value Standards? No.

About these Coverage Examples:



This is not a cost estimator. Treatments shown are just examples of how this plan might cover medical care. Your actual costs will be different depending on the actual care you receive, the prices your providers charge, and many other factors. Focus on the cost sharing amounts (deductibles, copayments and coinsurance) and excluded services under the plan. Use this information to compare the portion of costs you might pay under different health plans. Please note these coverage examples are based on self-only coverage.

Peg is Having a Baby
(9 months of in-network pre-natal care and a hospital delivery)

- The plan's overall deductible \$1,500
- Specialist coinsurance 10%
- Hospital (facility) coinsurance 10%
- Other coinsurance 10%

 Specialist office visits (*prenatal care*)
 Childbirth/Delivery Professional Services

 Specialist visit (*anesthesia*)

Managing Joe's type 2 Diabetes
(a year of routine in-network care of a well-controlled condition)

- Specialist coinsurance 10%
- Hospital (facility) coinsurance 10%
- Other coinsurance 10%

 Primary care physician office visits (*including disease education*)
 Diagnostic tests (*blood work*)
 Prescription drugs
 Durable medical equipment (*glucose meter*)

Mia's Simple Fracture
(in-network emergency room visit and follow up care)

- The plan's overall deductible \$1,500
- Specialist coinsurance 10%
- Hospital (facility) coinsurance 10%
- Other coinsurance 10%

This EXAMPLE event includes services like:
 Emergency room care (*including medical supplies*)
 Diagnostic test (*x-ray*)
 Durable medical equipment (*crutches*)
 Rehabilitation services (*physical therapy*)
