Inclement Weather Make-up Days

Due to schools being closed last Wednesday, schools will now be open on Wednesday, April 3, 2024. Please make adjustments to your calendars.

If there is an additional inclement weather day causing schools to be closed, schools will be open on Friday, May 24, 2024.

The third inclement weather day will be Asynchronous instruction.

The fourth – ninth inclement weather days will be Synchronous instruction.

What does Asycnchronous and Sychronous instruction mean?

- ★ Asynchronous instruction will be provided by the teachers for the students to work on independently, at home, at their own pace, and at the time that's best for the families. Teachers will provide a schedule of Office Hours to support students with questions or concerns virtually. Work will be accessed by students in grades 2-5 through Schoology. Students in grades PreK-1 will be given paper packets to complete.
- ★ Synchronous instruction will have teachers instruct students online through Zoom. These sessions are four hours long and are a mix of students receiving instruction from the teacher and the students completing work independently.

How is attendance taken?

- → Students who participate in Schoology/Zoom and/or complete the assigned work are marked present.
- → Students who do not participate will be provided Make-up work.

How will my child join sessions through Zoom or access Schology?

- Using a device at home
- Using a Chromebook issued from school where a Chromebook user agreement has been completed.
- The school will send needed Chromebooks home with the A/C adapters to be used on virtual days and then brought back in the next school day.

Ready to Read Act Letters

K-1 - Students will complete the middle of the year Acadience Reading K-6 benchmark. Results will be reported to families at the end of marking period 3. The purpose of this assessment is to monitor your child's development in reading, to identify students needing additional help, and to guide the teacher's classroom instruction. Both Kindergarten and Grade 1 teachers are implementing Fundations this school year. Fundations provides an explicit approach to reading and spelling with phonics. Students who score below the Fundations Unit Tests receive re-teaching of specific skills. In addition all students meet with a Chapter One tutor throughout the week.

Grades 2-5 - Students will complete the middle of the year Acadience Reading K-6 benchmark beginning in January. Results will be reported to families at the end of marking period 3. The purpose of this assessment is to monitor your child's development in reading, to identify students needing additional help, and to guide the teacher's classroom instruction. For the interim, students in Grades 2-5 will continue receiving differentiated reading instruction.
